Get involved with our workshops!

Several of the workshops have started.

We have starting to draft our Family Help Assessment & Plan suggestion so far from a young person is that they become known as Our Family Today, Our Family Tomorrow. The aim is to develop a single assessment and plan with a family and to ensure that families only tell their story once, we know that this is one of the families' biggest frustrations. As part of our Big Conversation a parent recently told us "I am exhausted. I feel like for the past year I have talked and talked and talked. But what has been done? Nothing. As a family we are deteriorating, our situation is no better, if anything it is worse. We are sent for assessment after assessment and from what I can see we are always someone else's problem. Eventually, someone is going to have to help us.".

We have started to scope out the role of the Lead Practitioner, looking at the support that should be available for all leads, training available alongside skill set, knowledge, capacity, resources and mapping out existing pathways, to ensure we are working effectively with children, young people, and families.

We have started to look at the Family Network Support Packages which will provide practical and financial support to enable family networks to help children and young people stay safe and thrive at home.
