Second Safeguarding Adults Reviews Analysis 2019 - 2023

Second Safeguarding Adults Review Analysis 2019- 2023 webinar

This webinar will present the results of the second national analysis of safeguarding adult reviews in England. It will present a detailed analysis of the types of abuse and neglect, and the nature of adult safeguarding concerns as reported in 652 reviews.

This analysis will offer both a regional and a national perspective. Some comparisons will be made with the first national analysis. The webinar will then present the findings and recommendations from a stratified sample of 229 safeguarding adult reviews across five domains - direct practice, the team around the person, organisational support for practice, governance and the national context within which adult safeguarding is situated.

Finally, some suggestions will be offered for improvement priorities.

ChatHealth is a confidential text messaging service for 11- to 19-year-olds. It is a quick and easy way for young people to access health advice and support.

Zarina won this award in recognition of her outstanding performance and valuable contribution towards the deployment of ChatHealth at Walsall.

Known as the 'ChatHealth Queen' for her service, Zarina has not only shown a great commitment to the parents/carers of Walsall, but a desire to improve ChatHealth by providing support for her colleagues and being instrumental in the further development of the service.

She received, a Digital Health Star pin badge and a goody bag of branded giveaways to share with her team. She also received some flowers from the 0-19 service.



Cavell awards

The Walsall Healthcare 0-19 Service are very pleased to have had two nominations for the national Cavell Excellence in Nursing awards. Jeanette Williamson was nominated for her outstanding safeguarding awareness when delivering the National Child Measurement Programme. Jeanette delivers the programme to children in reception year and in year 6. Whilst measuring one child, she identified concerns of chronic neglect and emotional wellbeing. Jeanette went above and beyond to ensure that this child's needs were met and that he was safeguarded in a timely manner. Jeanette was highly commended by Cavell.

Kristina Liston was also nominated for a Cavell Award. Kristina is a Health in Pregnancy Practitioner. Kristina identified that babies and infants in Walsall were not always having the essential items they needed. In pregnancy, parents were concerned about ensuring they had the items they needed following birth of baby. This became especially hard due to the current financial pressures that many families are facing. Kristina, in her own time, went above and beyond to set up a baby bank with essential goods that babies may need. She contacted local companies for donations of items such as baby wipes and nappies. In addition, Kristina was given clothes for babies, which she laundered at home and brought back to the office. She, with the support of her team, set up a facility where staff can get items a family may need. Kristina has made a positive difference to children and families in Walsall.

Trust Excellence Awards

Kristina Liston also won the Trust Excellence award for unsung hero. Well done Kristina.

In addition to Kristina's nomination to the trust excellence awards, the service had many more nominations. The Single Point of Access, The Targeted Team and the Health in Pregnancy Team all had nominations for excellence awards. We are proud to say we had 19 staff in total have individual nominations. Well done all!

Of the total of 22 nominations, we were very pleased to have 3 finalists. These were Kristina Liston- Health in Pregnancy Practitioner, Alice Marston- School Nurse nursery nurse and Carol Williams- Teenage Pregnancy Team Leader. We are very proud of you all. Well done!



MMR Vaccine

With the new school term underway and childhood infections like measles and whooping cough on the rise, parents and carers are being urged to ensure their children are up to date with their vaccinations.

Childhood infections can cause serious complications. The infections can cause a child to miss out on school due to time spent unwell, end up in hospital and even experience life-long complications.

The MMR (measles, mumps and rubella) vaccine is one of the many vaccinations offered for free on the NHS and it is safe and effective. All children are invited for their first MMR vaccine on the NHS when they turn one. The second dose is given when they reach three years and four months of age.

Having two doses of the vaccine provides the best protection against MMR and adults and older children can be vaccinated at any age if they have not been fully vaccinated before.

The whooping cough (pertussis) vaccine is also offered for free on the NHS and is routinely given to babies and younger children. Pregnant women should also have the whooping cough vaccine.



To help people come forward, clinics offering the MMR vaccine will be taking place this month in Walsall:

Pinfold Health Centre, Bloxwich (WS3 3JP) - Saturday 20 and 27 April, both days between 1:30pm and 4:30pm

* Broadway Medical Centre (WS1 3HD) - Saturday 27 April from 10am to 4pm.

The above clinics are open to those born after 1970 who haven't received both doses and are registered with a participating Walsall-based GP practice. Appointments can be booked by calling 01922 501999.

There are also clinics across the Black Country between April and July offering the MMR vaccine for all eligible children who are due or have missed a dose. The DTP vaccine which provides protection against diphtheria, tetanus, and pertussis (whooping cough) and the MenACWY vaccine which helps protect against meningitis and septicaemia (blood poisoning) are also available at these clinics. Full details are on the NHS Black Country ICB website.

Parents who are unsure if their child is up to date with all their routine vaccinations can check their child's Red Book (personal child health record) or contact their GP practice.

It's never too late to catch up. Check your child's red book or contact your GP practice to find out and to book in any missed doses.

Free CYP Mental Health support with Black Country Health NHS Trust

FREE Mental Health Support for Young people in the Black Country: Wysa in conjunction with Black Country NHS Foundation Trust

Black Country NHS Foundation Trust (BCHFT) has commissioned Wysa, a mental health chatbot and virtual mental health support platform, to provide a bespoke version of the Everyday Mental Health by Wysa app for young people across Walsall, Wolverhampton, Dudley and Sandwell.

This bespoke version of Wysa, especially for secondary aged young people in the Black Country, is being provided as an anonymous support tool for all secondary school aged young people as both preventative support, and as a waitlist support tool for young people referred to BCHFT services. It is free for them to download and use, and they will have access to it for 12 months from the time they download it.

We are keen to reach all young people across the Black Country, and we provide a variety of support material to help with this, which includes posters, images for screens, PHSE lesson plans or slides for assemblies, leaflets for both young people and parents / carers, as well as more in depth information for both clinical staff and school staff. We can also provide information on how staff and other adults can download a trial version of the Black Country version of Wysa Every Day Mental Health.

West Midlands Domestic Abuse & Sexual Assault and Abuse Standards 2024 - 2028


The new standards were launched by the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner.

These standards are updating the previously published regional 2015 Domestic Violence & Abuse standards and 2016 Rape and Sexual Violence standards and will help your organisation to prepare for occasions where you may need to work with and/or support a victim-survivor of domestic abuse and/or sexual assault and abuse and feel confident in how you respond to them to ensure they get the most appropriate support.
