Exploitation

NSPCC Learning has published a blog as part of the Why language matters series on why it's important for professionals to consider the language they use when talking about child criminal exploitation. The blog explores how the terms 'recruited' and 'working' minimise children's experiences of criminal exploitation. It also discusses how professionals can approach the topic of criminal exploitation with other professionals and the children they work with.

Key points

- Terms like 'working' and 'recruited' can minimise the exploitation a child or young person is experiencing and hide the true nature of the abuse and harm.
- Children may not be aware that they are experiencing criminal exploitation and may not relate to or engage with the language professionals use. Use language that children are comfortable with. This can help them to talk about their experiences and help you clearly communicate concerns.
- Move away from terminology used by people who exploit children and use language that focuses on the harm the child has experienced. This can help everyone working with the child discuss and identify the right level of support needed.





Working Together 2023 & Families First for Children

WSP are working closely with our partners leading the DfE Pathfinder 'Families First for Children' programme in order to develop our partnership links with Education Providers (a requirement of Working Together 2023).

Last month we've visited colleagues in the Walsall Association of Secondary Heads, Designated Safeguarding Leads Workshop, Walsall Learning Alliance and Special Heads Forum as we develop our plans. Next steps are to engage with those in the Early Years, Maintained Nurseries Forum, Primary Nursery and Special Forum and Further Education Sector. The Safeguarding Partnership will be establishing an Education Subgroup and are keen to hear from Heads/Deputy Heads, Nursery Managers, Further Education Heads who are interested in joining this forum.

Reducing / Preventing Violence, ASB & Risk of Exploitation

The summer period can be a challenging time for many children and young people, especially those who are vulnerable, at risk, or living in areas with high levels of youth anti-social behaviour (ASB) and violence.

The Community Safety Partnership has been collaborating with partners to identify the needs and gaps in the current provision of summer activities and services, and to develop a coordinated plan to address them.

The aim is to maximise the resources and opportunities available to support and engage these children and young people, and to reduce the risk and occurrence of ASB, violence, and criminal exploitation during the summer months.

Mentoring providers have a vital role in achieve this goal as we know mentoring can be a very effective way of engaging our most vulnerable children/young people and enabling them to engage in positive activities, while diverting them away from any risk or vulnerabilities.

Please consider any children and young people who you believe would benefit from this additional mentoring support over the summer period.

Consent from the child and their parent/carer is needed for all referrals.

The referral form will be used to match children/young people to the "best fit" mentoring provider.
